Additional Information:

BIRTH: She was born Louisa Oldroyd on 09 May 1863 and baptised 25 December 1863 at All Hallows Kirkburton.

PARENTS: Her parents were Amos Oldroyd, tailor and Sophia Oldroyd, nee Carter – they were married on 16 February 1863 at All Hallows Parish Church, Kirkburton.

Amos's father was William Oldroyd, a weaver, and Sophia's father was Robert Carter, also a weaver.

Amos and Sophia had two daughters – Louisa born 1863 and Emma born 1868

MARRIAGE: Louisa married Fred Moulson, a plumber/painter, on 06 April 1893 at All Hallows, Kirkburton. Fred's father was Fred Moulson, a stonemason.

CHILDREN: Louisa and Fred had two sons – David Frederic Moulson born 1896 and Ernest Arthur Moulson born 1901.

DEATH: Louisa died in November 1939 and was buried on 29 November 1939 at All Hallows Parish Church, Kirkburton aged 76.

OTHER INFORMATION: In the 1911 census, the family was living at Slant Gate, Kirkburton. Louisa's husband was working as a plumber and painter, David was 15 and Ernest was 10 and both boys were still at school.

Louisa's sons David and Ernest both served during the Great War and survived - their names are listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
