BIRTH: Alice was born on 18 January 1890 and was baptised at All Hallows Parish Church, Kirkburton on 30 April 1891.

PARENTS: PARENTS: Alice's father was Joe Scott, a stone mason and her mother was Jane Scott, nee Armitage. Alice's parents were married on 11 February 1869 at All Hallows Parish Church, Kirkburton.

Joe's father was John Hampshire Scott, farmer. Jane's father was George Armitage, farmer.

Joe and Jane had four children – George Victor born in October 1879, Agnes born on 12 April 1882, Albert born on 09 February 1888, and Alice born on 18 January 1890.

MARRIAGE: Alice married Fred Peel, a chemist's assistant from Cotteridge, on 09 August 1919 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton.

Fred's father was William Peel, a colliery clerk.

OTHER INFORMATION: Alice was a dressmaker in the 1911 census and she was living with her mother, brothers and sister in Highburton. George Victor was a weaver, Albert was a joiner and Agnes was a weaver.

Their father, Joe, died in January 1894 and he was buried at All Hallows Parish Church, Kirkburton on 10 January 1894.

Alice's brother Albert served during the Great War and survived - his name is listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
