BIRTH: Elizabeth was born Elizabeth Carter on 13 August 1879 and baptised at All Hallows Parish Church, Kirkburton on 12 October 1879.

PARENTS: Her father was Arthur Carter, a shovel maker, and her mother was Ada Carter, nee Matthews.

Arthur and Ada were married on 14 September 1878 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton. Arthur's father was Richard Carter, an edge tool maker and Ada's father was George Matthews, a warehouseman.

Arthur and Ada had four children – Elizabeth born on 13 August 1879, Herman born on 08 October 1881, Ethel born on 20 June 1884 and Lawrence born on 22 July 1886.

MARRIAGE: Elizabeth married James Dyson Singleton, warper overlooker in woollen mill, on 16 April 1906 at All Hallows Parish Church, Kirkburton.

James's father was John Albert Singleton who was deceased by time of marriage and his mother was Sarah Ellen Singleton.

CHILDREN: Elizabeth and James had one daughter – Ada Dorothy born on 06 April 1907 and baptised on 02 June 1907 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton

OTHER INFORMATION: In the 1911 census, Elizabeth, James and Ada were living at Hallas Bottom, Kirkburton.

Elizabeth was the sister in law of Ann Louisa Singleton.

Elizabeth's brothers in law, Joe and Willie Singleton, both served in the Great War and returned – their names are listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
