BIRTH: Isabel was born on 25 May 1882 and baptised on 06 August 1882 at St John's Church Kirkheaton.

PARENTS: Her father was Henry Sykes, chemist and druggist, and her mother was Fanny Sykes, nee Bentley.

Henry and Fanny were married on 12 January 1880 at Kirkheaton Parish Church. Henry's father was Richard Sykes, gentleman, and Fanny's father was George Bentley, manufacturer.

Henry and Fanny had five children – Isabel, Bessie Sykes, George Sykes, Richard Sykes and Henry Bentley Sykes.

OTHER INFORMATION: In the 1891 census, Isabel was living with her parents, brothers and sister at Wakefield Road, Moldgreen, Dalton with a servant and two assistants in her father's druggist business.

In the 1901 census, Elizabeth was 18 and listed as the Head living at 32 Wakefield Road with her brother Richard, 17, who was a chemist's apprentice, together with a chemist's assistant and a domestic servant. Also in that census, Elizabeth's father, mother and brother, George, had moved and were living at Copley House, Kirkburton.

In the 1911 census the whole family was living at Copley House, Kirkburton. Her brother Richard was a chemist and druggist, Henry was a chemist's assistant, George was a farm pupil.

Isabel's brother, George Sykes, served during the Great War and his name is listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
