**PARENTS:** Mary's father was Morris Woolger, woollen merchant and her mother was Mary Elizabeth Woolger, nee Garner.

Mary married Morris Woolger on 24 May 1882 at Huddersfield Parish Church. Mary's father was John Garner, parish clerk. Morris's father was Richard Woolger, Merchant.

At the time of their marriage Morris was living in Brighton and came to Huddersfield to live when he married Mary on 12 May 1882. They had three children, Alice born in 1884 in New York, Doris born in October 1889 and Clarence born on 20 June 1886.

**OTHER INFORMATION:** In the 1911 census, Doris's mother was a widow living on private means with her daughter Doris, son Clarence and a servant, Ada Reynolds, at Moorlands, Kirkburton.

Doris's sister, Alice, married Lionel Brook Holliday on 31 March 1908 at Holy Trinity Church, Huddersfield.

Doris is on the Electoral Register at Moorlands, Kirkburton from 1918 to 1928. Between 1948 and 1951 she is listed as living at Grice Nook, Slant Gate, Kirkburton.

Doris's brother, Clarence Woolger, and her brother in law, Lionel Brook Holliday, both served in the Great War and their names are listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
