BIRTH: Hannah was born Hannah Armitage on 12 May 1867.

PARENTS: Hannah's father was Sam Armitage, stone engraver and her mother was Sarah Ann Armitage, nee Shaw.

MARRIAGE: Hannah married Arthur Carter, Spade and Shovel manufacturer, at the Wesleyan Methodist Chapel Queen Street Huddersfield on 06 April 1901. Arthur was a widower living in Tanyard Cottage Kirkburton at the time of their marriage.

Arthur's father was Richard Carter, shovel maker, was deceased at the time of the marriage. At the time of their marriage Hannah was a confectioner living at Denefield House, Kirkburton.

DEATH: Hannah died in Leeds in October 1941 aged 74. She was buried at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton on 18 October 1941.
