BIRTH: Nellie was born on 31 August 1893.

PARENTS: Nellie's father was Joseph Dickinson, farmer, and her mother Emma Dickinson nee Mosley.

Nellie's parents were married on 11 August 1881 at Emmanuel Church, Shelley. Joseph's father was William Dickinson, farmer and Emma's father was Richard Mosley, inn keeper. Joseph and Emma had five children. Louisa born 1883, Florrie born 1888, Edgar born 1890, Nellie born 31 August 1893 and Frank born 1901.

MARRIAGE: Nellie was married after the war on 01 September 1921 at Shelley Emmanuel Church, Shelley to Joseph Jessop Newsome. Joseph served in the First World War and survived – his name is on the men's memorial board in Kirkburton Library.

CHILDREN: Nellie and Joseph's son, John, was born in September 1922

OTHER INFORMATION: Nellie, 17, was listed as a confectionary business apprentice at 1911 census. Her brothers were Edgar 20 and Frank 10 at time of census.

Nellie's husband, Joseph Jessop Newsome served in the Great War and returned. He married Nellie in 1921 and his name is listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
