BIRTH: Henrietta was born on 24 May 1868 in Edinburgh.

PARENTS: Henrietta's father was Edward Langford Dillon and her mother was Sarah Phillips Dillon, nee Cotter and they were married on 23/05/1865 in Cork, Ireland.

They had three children – Francis William born 1867, Henrietta born 24 May 1868 and Annie Louisa born on 08 February 1871

OTHER INFORMATION: In 1901 census the family were living at Percy Place, Pembroke, West Dublin - Edward was a JP for Cork and Retired Major General.

There are military records for him with the 18th Royal Irish Regiment fighting in the Crimea progressing from Ensign to Lt. Colonel. Their son Francis was baptised on 30 June 1867 at St Michael the Archangel Church in Aldershot which ties in with the army connection.

In 1911, Henrietta was employed as a governess to the children of Mary Isabel Lloyd Lloyd 37 widow born Kensington, London and living on own means at Llanllawddog, Wales. Mary's mother, Harriet Isabella Pierce, 59 widow living on own means was living with them and she was a British subject born in Aden, Arabia. There were 7 servants.

Henrietta's sister Annie Louisa was also a governess to children of Bessie Hadfield Munro born in Nelson, New Zealand. The family were living in Worthing at the time of the census.

It appears that Henrietta worked as cover at the Kirkburton Auxiliary Military Hospital, 5 days in Feb 1918, 4 days in March 1918, 6 days in May 1918, 6 days in June 1918 and 5 days in July 1918.

On the 1939 register, Henrietta GV Dillon birth date was given as 24/05/1868 in Edinburgh. In 1939, she and her sister Annie Louisa Dillon were Honorary Superintendents of the Soldier's Home, Pleasant Row, Gillingham, Kent. They had a housemaid and 4 men who worked in the HM Dockyard and 2 men who were Coffee Barmen at the Soldiers Home.
