BIRTH: She was born Ann Oxley about 1864

PARENTS: Ann's father was Frank Oxley, assistant overseer, and her mother was Isabella Oxley, nee Gill. They were married in the second quarter of 1873 in Huddersfield. Frank and Isabella had three children – Fred, Ann and Emma. Her father died in September 1907 and was buried at Highburton Non-conformist chapel.

MARRIAGE: Ann was married to George Haigh, joiner, on 14 June 1897 and their marriage is listed on the Non-Conformist Records. George's father was Jesse Haigh.

CHILDREN: George and Ann's daughter, Edith, was born on 21 November 1903. George's daughter Ann Elizabeth was born on 06 July 1893 and was Ann's step daughter.

DEATH: Ann died in the second quarter of 1949

OTHER INFORMATION: Ann was the third wife of George Haigh, joiner and cabinet maker.

George's first wife was Ellen Carter and her father was Richard Carter, an edge tool maker. They were married at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton on 15 August 1885. Ellen died the following year.

George's second wife was Sarah Smith, whose father was Amos Smith, a mason, and they were married on 16 July 1887 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton. Sarah was the mother of Ann Elizabeth Haigh. Sarah was buried on 07 January 1894 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton
