**BIRTH:** Ann Elizabeth was born on 16 September 1893

**PARENTS:** Ann Elizabeth's father was George Haigh, joiner and cabinet maker, and her mother was Sarah Haigh, nee Smith. George's father was Jesse Haigh, a joiner and Sarah's father was Amos Smith, a mason.

**MARRIAGE:** Ann and George were married on 16 July 1887 at All Hallows, Kirkburton.

**CHILDREN:** Ann Elizabeth Haigh was their only child

**DEATH:** Ann Elizabeth died on 20 June 1988 and was living at North Spring House, Kirkburton at the time of her death.

**OTHER INFORMATION:** Ann Elizabeth was the step daughter of Ann Haigh, nee Oxley who her father married on 14 June 1897 after the death of her mother Sarah. Sarah was George's second wife and she was buried on 07 January 1894 at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton.

George's first wife was Ellen Carter and her father was Richard Carter, edge tool maker. They were married at All Hallows, Kirkburton on 15 August 1885. Ellen died the following year.

Ann Elizabeth started work at Kirkburton hospital on 29 April 1915 doing general ward work and minor dressings 10 hrs per week until 01 November 1916. On 02 November 1916 she then transferred as a nurse (white card) to Whalley Military Hospital was still working there on 04 February 1919.

Elizabeth's step mother, Ann, also worked at the Kirkburton Military Hospital.
