**BIRTH:** Emily was born Emily Booth about 1867.

**PARENTS:** Emily's parents were Abraham Booth woollen manufacturer and tailor living at High Cross and Elizabeth Booth, nee Mellor.

Abraham married Elizabeth at the Queen Street Chapel Huddersfield on 25 December 1865 - they were both from Kirkburton. Abraham's father was Mark Booth, grocer and Elizabeth's father was George Mellor, fancy manufacturer's bookkeeper.

**MARRIAGE:** Emily married Arthur Haigh.

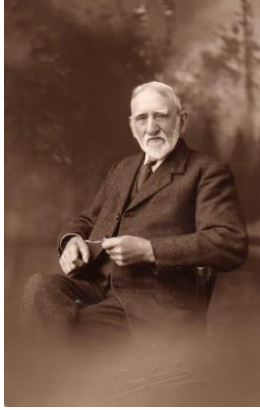
