BIRTH: Hilda was born on 18 February 1891.

PARENTS: Hilda was the daughter of Joseph Hepworth saddle and harness maker and Mary Bithia Swallow Hepworth, nee Blacker. Joseph and Mary were married at St Michael's Church, Emley on 20 April 1881. Joseph's father was Robert Hepworth, a saddler and Mary's father was Joseph Blacker, a joiner. Joseph and Mary had four children – Robert, William, Hilda and Sarah Ann

MARRIAGE: On 14 May 1919, Hilda married Thomas Haigh, a chemist of Rock Dene, Kirkburton at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton. Thomas's father was John Haigh, a joiner.

OTHER INFORMATION: In the 1911 census, Hilda's father was a widower, his son Robert was a saddler, his son William was a motor mechanic. His daughters Hilda and Sarah Ann had no occupations listed on the census. Hilda's sister, Sarah Ann, married Frank Singleton a Woollen Manufacturer at All Hallows Church, Kirkburton on 10 October 1912.

Hilda was the sister of Robert Hepworth who served and returned from the First World War. Hilda's brother in law, Frank Singleton, also served during the War. Robert and Frank's names are both listed on the Memorial Board in Kirkburton Library.
